Before Holy Mass, we should arrive early and spend time with God in prayer, preparing for the Holy Sacrifice. We should ask God to help us pay attention during the Mass. We can also read the readings from the Bible that will be read at Mass.

**Sign of the Cross and Greeting:** The priest begins the Holy Mass with the Sign of the Cross. This reminds us of what the Holy Mass is.

**Penitential Rite:** We remember that our sins offend God and we tell Him that we are sorry for them, so that we can participate better in the Holy Mass.

**Gloria:** On Sundays and other special feast days, we sing a special hymn of praise. It begins with the words that the Angels used when they told the Shepherds about the birth of Jesus.

**Liturgy of the Word:** After the Collect prayer, we hear some readings from the Bible. The most important reading is the reading from the Holy Gospel because they tell us about the life and words of Jesus. We should ask the Holy Spirit to help us listen carefully.

**Liturgy of the Eucharist:** The second half of Holy Mass is most important. This is when we will participate in the Sacrifice of Christ.

**Offertory:** Bread and wine are offered to the priest by the people so that he can offer them to God. We should also give God our hearts with the bread and wine.

**Consecration:** During the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest thanks God and offers Him prayers for us. He offers God the bread and wine and they become the Body and Blood of Christ.

**Holy Communion:** If we are properly prepared, we receive the Body of Christ in our bodies and God comes into our souls in a special way.

After Holy Mass, we should stay a few minutes and pray, especially if we have received Holy Communion. We should thank God for the gift of the Mass and the Holy Eucharist.

Antes de la Santa Misa, debemos llegar temprano y pasar tiempo con Dios en oración, preparándonos para el Santo Sacrificio. Debemos pedirle a Dios que nos ayude a prestar atención durante la Misa. También podemos leer las lecturas de la Biblia que se leerán en la Misa.

**Signe de la cruz y saludo:** El sacerdote comienza la Santa Misa con la señal de la cruz. Esto nos recuerda lo que es la Santa Misa.

**Rito penitencial:** Recordamos que nuestros pecados ofenden a Dios y le pedimos perdón por ellos, para poder participar mejor en la Santa Misa.

**Gloria:** Los domingos y otros días festivos especiales, cantamos un himno de alabanza especial. Comienza con las palabras que los ángeles utilizaron cuando anunciaron a los pastores el nacimiento de Jesús.

**Liturgia de la Palabra:** Después de la oración colecta, escuchamos algunas lecturas de la Biblia. La lectura más importante es la del Santo Evangelio, porque nos habla de la vida y las palabras de Jesús. Debemos pedir al Espíritu Santo que nos ayude a escuchar con atención.

**Liturgia de la Eucaristía:** La segunda parte de la Santa Misa es la más importante. Es entonces cuando participamos en el Sacrificio de Cristo.

**Ofertorio:** El pueblo ofrece pan y vino al sacerdote para que él los ofrezca a Dios. También debemos ofrecer a Dios nuestros corazones junto con el pan y el vino.

**Consagración:** Durante la Plegaria Eucarística, el sacerdote da gracias a Dios y le ofrece oraciones por nosotros. Ofrece a Dios el pan y el vino, que se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo.

**Santa Comunión:** Si estamos debidamente preparados, recibimos el Cuerpo de Cristo en nuestros cuerpos y Dios entra en nuestras almas de una manera especial.

Después de la Santa Misa, debemos quedarnos unos minutos y rezar, especialmente si hemos recibido la Santa Comunión. Debemos dar gracias a Dios por el don de la Misa y la Sagrada Eucaristía.
